Byron Abalos is a Filipino-Canadian actor, playwright, screenwriter and theatre producer based in Toronto. He is a published playwright, Dora Award-winning actor and a 2025 Canadian Screen Award nominee for his writing on the Filipinx-Canadian sketch comedy television show ABROAD. Select Theatre credits include: Monday Nights (6th Man Collective/The Theatre Centre), Twelve Angry Men (Soulpepper), Roshni (Theatre Passe Muraille), paper series (Cahoots), The Making of St. Jerome (EastBound Theatre) and Banana Boys (fu-GEN). Select film/TV credits include: The Man From Toronto, Luckiest Girl Alive, ABROAD, Coroner, Murdoch Mysteries, What We Do In The Shadows, Baroness Von Sketch, The Boys, Return to Christmas Creek, Mr. Dressup and The Magic Schoolbus. KEITH BARKER

Keith Barker is a member of the Métis Nation of Ontario. He is a playwright, actor, and director from Northwestern Ontario. Keith is the Director of the Foerster Bernstein New Play Development Program at the Stratford Festival, and the former Artistic Director at Native Earth Performing Arts in Toronto. He is the winner of the Dora Mavor Moore Award and the Playwrights Guild's Carol Bolt Award for best new play. Keith was a finalist for the Governor General's Award for English Drama in 2018 for his play, This Is How We Got Here. He received a Saskatchewan and Area Theatre Award for Excellence in Playwriting for his play, The Hours That Remain, as well as a Yukon Arts Award for Best Art for Social Change. Keith was the recipient of the Arts and Letters Award in 2021. Keith is a participating playwright in Climate Change Theatre Action 2023 with his short play, Undertow.

THOMAS MORGAN JONES



For over 20 years, Thomas' work as a director, playwright, movement coach, dramaturg and instructor has been seen on stages nationally and internationally, garnering numerous awards and nominations. Working across genres, from new plays to TYA, musicals to dance-theatre and the classics, he has created productions on stages of all sizes. He has collaborated with companies including: The Stratford Festival, Prairie Theatre Exchange, Theatre New Brunswick, Theatre Passe Muraille, Theatre Direct, WeeFestival, Carousel Players, Manitoba Theatre for Young People, Young People's Theatre, Modern Times Stage Company, Cahoots, Charlottetown Festival, vAct, and many others. Thomas holds a BA from the University of Guelph, an MA from the University of Toronto, and has trained extensively in the Suzuki Method of Actor Training and Viewpoints with both SITI Company (New York) and also with SCOT (Japan). He is currently an alumni ambassador with SITI Company.

A former artistic director of Theatre New Brunswick and Prairie Theatre Exchange, he has programmed over 40 world premieres. Thomas is currently the Executive Artistic Director of the National Theatre School of Canada.



HELEN JUVONEN

Helen is the Co-Artistic Director of Guild Festival Theatre, the founder and Artistic Director of Thought For Food Productions as well as an independent actor, director, producer and writer. For GFT she has directed The Drowning Girls, The Red Priest and Salt-Water Moon. This summer she directed the world premiere of Heratio.

With Thought For Food she has produced, directed and/or appeared in over a dozen shows including her own play The Aleatory Project. TFF highlights include directing Agnes of God, Love's Labour's Lost, and The Universal Wolf; producing and performing in the Canadian Premiere of The Memo by Vaclav Havel (translation by Paul Wilson) and producing Dark Heart. As a screenwriter Helen has created the award-winning short film "Advances" and the web series "You're Never Alone". Helen is the recipient of the Cayle Chernin Award, the Queen's Platinum Jubilee pin and the King Charles III Coronation Medal.

She is also a Jeopardy! Champion.



JARETH

Born in Singapore, Jareth is a stage designer now based in Toronto by way of Calgary. He has a love for new work that examines identity politics, culture, and heritage.




TYLER J. SEGUIN






